Women at the Center: Prioritizing women's rights and empowerment in Covid-19 pandemic response and recovery

Manila, October 22-24 2022: The regional meeting on Women Center: at the Prioritizing women's rights and empowerment in Covid-19 pandemic and response recovery was organized by the Forum Asian of Parliamentarians on Population and Development (AFPPD) and the Philippine Legislators' Commit-tee on Population and Development (PLCPD). supported the United by Nations Fund (UNFPA) through the Japan Trust Fund (JTF). It brought together more than 70 participants from parliaments, aovernments. international organizations, vouth organizations and academia, involving 18 countries, to share and discuss good practices in legislation policies, and programmes aimed at gender equality and women empowerment. The Meeting paid special attention to those

gender issues, including how to eliminate discrimination and prevent violence against women and girls, empower women and engage them in decisionmaking policies, and fulfill sexual and reproductive health, in the spirit of leaving no one behind.

Following extensive discussions and interventions during the working sessions, parliamentarians at the meeting collectively formulated 17 key recommendations. Notable among these recommendations is ensuring stronger political commitment to accelerate progress towards three critical goals: the elimination of preventable maternal deaths, the elimination of unmet need for family planning, and the elimination of gender-based violence and femicide (GBVF) and harmful practices. These efforts aim to ensure that all people, especially adolescents, can lead healthy and productive lives.

In his opening statement, Hon. Prof. Takemi Keizo, Chair of AFPPD. emphasized the critical role of women's empowerment in achieving the goals of ICPD25 and the 2030 Agenda. He stressed that the sustainable development of any nation relies heavily on strategic investments, with a particular focus on the impact on women, girls and the elderly. He underlined the transformative potential of parliamentarians as catalysts positive change for and acknowledged the significant contribution of AFPPD in the region in addressing pressing gender issues.

This event attracted a diverse audience, including government officials, NGOs and vibrant youth groups. The importance of youth was highlighted further through virtual visits to youth-focused PIK-R (Youth centers, Information and Counseling Centres) and Posyandu Remaja (Youth Integrated Services).

AFPPD Executive Committee Meeting (ExeCom)

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, the 93rd AFPPD ExeCom meeting marked a significant milestone as it was the first face-to-face meeting since 2020. It was held on 22 October 2022, as a hybrid event that took place both online and offline in Manila, Philippines, and was organized in partnership with the Philippine National Committee (NatCom). The meeting provided an opportunity for parliamentarians to come together, share insights, and discuss important issues related to population and development in the Asian region. The 93rd ExeCom became an important forum for members to address the continuing challenges of the pandemic and discuss strategies for sustainable development in a post-COVID world. General Assembly of AFPPD 2023

The AFPPD General Assembly in Tokyo in 2023 marked а significant milestone for the organisation and its members. While this biennial event normally includes leadership elections, the unique circumstances of this Assembly, with the last election two years ago, meant that it focused primarily on shaping AFPPD's direction. strategic lt also marked a return to face-to-face collaboration following the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, and underlined the AFPPD commitment of members to overcome these obstacles effectively. The Assembly played a crucial role in developing strategic plans and documents based the on collective insights of representatives countries. These documents will guide AFPPD's future efforts and will now be submitted to the Executive Committee (ExeCom) for validation to ensure alignment with the organisation's mission and goals. Overall, the 14th General Assembly reaffirmed the commitment of AFPPD members addressing to population and developmentrelated issues in the Asian region.

The Assembly consisted of three sessions, each of which was AFPPD's integral to future initiatives. Session 1 which focused on the presentation and adoption of AFPPD's Strategic Plan for 2023-25, allowed member states to provide insights and comments for majority approval. Session 2 focused on discussions on the of AFPPD Standing hosting Committees and national level activities in 2024-2025, in line with the Strategic Plan. The agenda for Standing Committee meetinas and regional conferences was shared, and Member States were invited to consider hosting these events. Finally, session 3 featured presentations. Member State with each country giving a brief 10-minute overview of their efforts to address key population issues in line with AFPPD's three pillars. Workshop on Youth Empowerment Education, Employment, and Sexual and Reproductive health and Rights

PHNOM PENH, 27 February: AFPPD convened а major workshop in the Kingdom of Cambodia entitled "Empowering Youth: Education, Employment and Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights". Hon. Men Sam An, Deputy Prime Minister of Cambodia and President of CAPPD, opened the workshop by highlighting the importance of raising awareness of sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) among youth and marginalised groups. Ensuring their future development, including education, employment and social contribution, was a key concern. It highlighted key components "National Policy on of the Cambodia's Youth Development 2022-2026". which includes education, health, employment and institutional cooperation. Key areas promoted including vouth volunteerism, enterpreneurship and cultural,



environmental social and awareness. The workshop generated several recommendations, including the need for digital dynamic technology mechanisms enhance to cooperation in the development youth of and marginalized groups. In addition, the outcomes of the seminar should inform localized policy and legal instruments. There was strong support for continued collaboration between legislative institutions to strengthen parliamentary oversight of policy implementation, particul-arly in the areas of youth education, employment and SRHR.

In the opening remark, Hon. Prof. Takemi has mentioned that youth empowerment is one of the key pillars that AFPPD is working on. In fact, youth represent more than half of the world's population, so there is a need to ensure opportunities for young people. Although significant progress has been made in promoting health, education and employment, nearly half of young people in the region face insecurity, either economic unemployed or employed, due to including structural barriers, cultural norms, which are reinforced by the COVID 19 pandemic. Hon. Professor Takemi highlighted that AFPPD has a critical role to play in addressing youth issues bv encouraging Member States to adopt relevant laws and policies on decent employment,



leadership and entrepreneurship among young people. In the closing remark, Hon. Dr. Jetn Sirathranont, Senator from Thailand, Secretary General of AFPPD. noted that the importance of youth and youth issues has brought about this workshop on youth empowerment, and the open discussions have provided the perspectives views and of professionals and academics from both government and private sectors to address the challenges and pave the way for solutions to empower youth. ICPD30: Policymaking Initiatives to Address National and Regional Population Trends

New Delhi, 22 August 2023: ICPD30, co-hosted by AFPPD and IAPPD, proved to be a momentous event this year. This important meeting coincided with India overtaking China to become the world's most populous nation.

Prof. P.J. Kurien, Chairperson of IAPPD, highlighted India's population, burgeoning especially its large youth population, and emphasized the importance of promoting positive attitudes and behaviors in youth development. Hon. Prof. Keizo Takemi, MP Japan and Chair of AFPPD. discussed the significance of the workshop. He noted India's role as host of the G20 and its influence in shaping AFPPD's contributions to the G20. He highlighted AFPPD's success in organizing meetings of member states that resulted in important declarations.



Ms. Andrea W. Wojnar, UNFPA's Executive Director for India and Bhutan, championed the cause of ensuring reproductive rights and choices for all, echoing the enduring message of the ICPD, 1994 Cairo which remains relevant in 2023. placed a strong emphasis on women's rights as human rights and highlighted the address violations need to early and forced such as spousal violence, marriage, unmet family planning needs, unwanted pregnancies and unsafe abortions as critical towards steps achieving gender equality and women's empowerment, in line with the goals of the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. Hon. Deepender Hooda, MP India and Vice-Chair of AFPPD, outlined the main objective of ICPD30: to facilitate dialogue between Indian parliamentarians. AFPPD, the Executive Committee, ExCom members, UNFPA and civil society ahead of the G20 Summit. Other MPs from Asia attended and made presentations too. Hon, Hector Appuhamy, MP Sri Lanka, Hon. Dil Kumari Rawal Thapa, MP Nepal, and Hon. Josephine Veronique Lacson-Noel, MP Philippines are examples.

Strategic Plan of AFPPD

AFPPD has adopted three key documents to guide its activities: the Resource Mobilisation Plan. the Strategic Plan and the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Plan. The Strategic Plan aims to promote the involvement of parliamentarians in addressing population issues in Asia and the Pacific, with a focus on women's empowerment and gender equality, youth engagement and ageing, while also active considering climate change as a cross-cutting issue. It outlines three critical programme-wide outcomes, ranging from aligning national legislation and budgets with the SDGs and ICPD+25, to influencing regional and global intergovernmental agendas on population issues. At the same time, the resource mobilisation strategy, which is closely aligned with the strategic plan, uses a four-pronged approach that includes building organisational capacity, sustaining and strengthening partnerships, diversifying funding sources, and creating external value. These outcomes work in synergy, with the diversification of funding sources dependent on the successful implementation of the previous steps. In addition, the M&E plan plays a crucial role in assessing the AFPPD's progress throughout the year to ensure that its goals and objectives are being met. For more details please click here.
